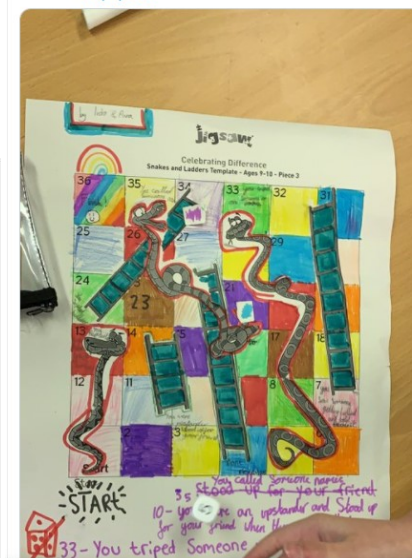

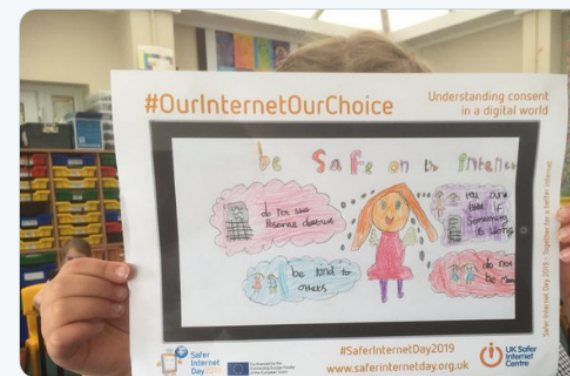

The children learned about a variety of risks. They discussed strategies for what to do in a risky situation. Peer pressure was discussed.

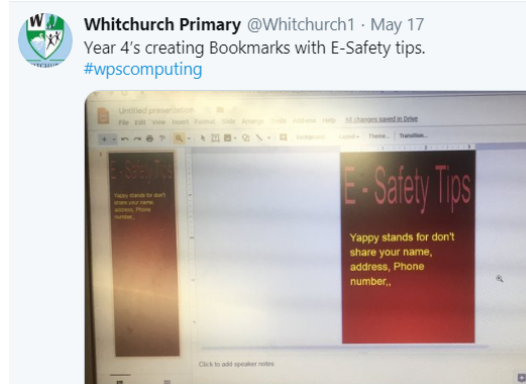
Drugs and Taking Risks

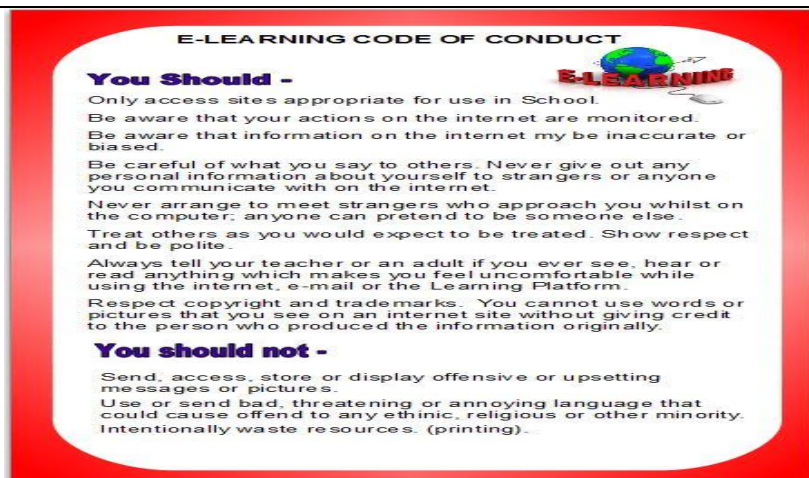

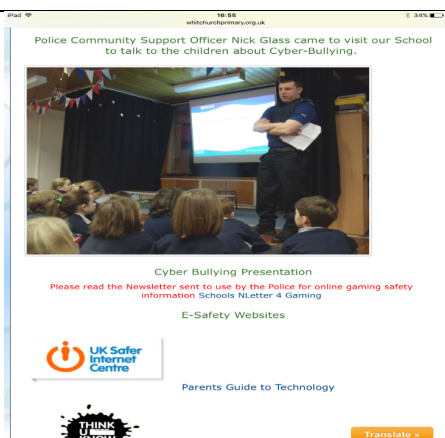
